



ABRAHAM LINCOLN



12th February is a historic day for the United States of America. But why? This is because 12th February is the birthday of the well-known figure, Abraham Lincoln. Abraham Lincoln was the 16th president of the US. He was, in fact, a very kind-hearted and honest president. Lincoln was born in a very poor family. He attended school for less than one year in his entire life. However, he had a great

desire to learn and was encouraged by his stepmother to read and write. At the age of 22, he settled in Illinois, located in the Midwestern region of the United States. He was then given the name, 'Honest Abe'. After trying for various jobs, he became a highly successful lawyer.

During the 1800's, there was a lot of discrimination between the blacks and whites. The people with white skin colour or the whites, felt that they were more superior than the blacks. They made them their slaves and made them do all sorts of odd jobs. These blacks were termed as 'Negroes' (a disrespectful term that is



no longer used). Despite being white, Lincoln was against slavery. This made him unpopular in the Southern states where slavery was favoured. But, the Northern states were with Lincoln, and were ready to fight for the freedom of the slaves. In 1860, Lincoln was elected as the president of the USA. After this election, the southern states decided to separate from the country. But Lincoln was determined to keep his country together. This led to a war between the Northern and Southern states. This war is popularly known as the American Civil War, and it lasted for four years. During the war, he signed the Emancipation Proclamation. and declared that he would free all the 3 million slaves of the US and make slavery illegal.



The war was won by the northern states and thus, the country would remain united. Even after his opponents lost to him, Abraham Lincoln was very kind and helped the southern states rebuild. Unfortunately, he was not alive to see his dream come true. On 14th April 1865, Abraham Lincoln was shot by John Wilkes Booth while watching a play in

the theatre on Good Friday. On the next day, 15th April 1865, Abraham Lincoln was pronounced dead. Though he is no more, Abraham Lincoln still lives in our memories and is remembered till this day. This great hero was one of the most remarkable presidents of the United States of America. His face has been carved on Mount Rushmore, along with three other presidents, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and Theodore Roosevelt. He is a role model to many.






Portfolio Presentation Report by Mansi Singhal 7A






Portfolio Presentation Report by Samanvi G7

My Mother Tongue - Telugu

What is a Mother Tongue?

The term "mother tongue" refers to a person's <u>native language</u> — that is, a language learned from birth. Also called a first language, dominant language, home language, and native tongue. Every place has a unique language with unique words and letters. In India there are a total of **121 languages** and 270 mother tongues.

My Mother Tongue

My mother tongue is Telugu, a language spoken in the Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. From my childhood my parents used to read Telugu stories which wire filled with humour, wit, and intelligent characters.

Anyone who knows Telugu, knows that the language is filled with puns and wordplay. This has allowed many Telugu writers to make intelligent political and social commentary for centuries without being openly rebellious. It has also generated an entire genre of comedy, which is smart and witty and does not insult the audience's intelligence. Instead of writing smart, crisp scripts, writers fall back on offensive, slapstick dialogue to create a stronger dramatic effect but this enthusiastic Telugu literature is in danger of being extinct. The classic Telugu books are nowadays being published in very less number due to many reasons — people preferring films over books, less Telugu readers, and a focus on English more than Telugu and many more.

Why do we need to learn our mother tongue?

The Intercultural Development Research Association (IDRA) reiterates that continuing to study your mother tongue after childhood helps you learn how to value your culture and heritage. For parents, keeping your first language alive at home teaches children to take pride in their culture and roots. In terms of its value in social interactions, speaking your first language can strengthen ties with family members. If the native language isn't maintained, important links to family members may be lost.
