### **Leap of Faith**



















# ARE YOU WITH ME?? Mother Nature is very beautiful, With grass, plants, flowers and more...


The teacher randomly assigned the groups to help us learn how to work with others whom we may not know very well and how we can collaborate to bring up something very unique and interesting.




